## **GOVERNMENT DEGREE COLLEGE ANI AT HARIPUR**

The Govt. College Ani is a countryside college situated in the pristine beauty of nature at place Haripur which is 7KM away. from Anni, the prominent tehsil headquarter of this area in district Kullu popularly known as outer Seraj. It came into being on June 17, 2006 with tireless efforts of the local people under leadership of octogenarian social worker Late Sh. Hari Ram. The college complex is spread over an area of nearly 23.6 bighas of land donated by the villagers who were keen on bringing a transformation through education in this remote locality of the state. The college building is beautifully designed in the background of hill landscape and the college shifted to the present campus in August, 2012.

The college is co-educational institution duly affiliated to the Himachal Pradesh University Shimla. Initially the Arts stream was started from the academic session 2006 – 07. The commerce faculty has been introduced from the session 2014 – 15 and science faculty has started its functioning from the session 2016 – 17. 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## GENERAL ADMISSION RULES

### ELIGIBILITY

A candidate will be eligible for admission to B.A./B.Com./B.Sc. 1<sup>st</sup> year, if he/ she has passed senior secondary (+2) examination (Academic Stream) conducted by the HP Board of School Education or An examination accepted as equivalent thereto by the various bodies of HP University.

- (i) Provided that the candidate who has passed the qualifying examination with commerce stream shall be given preference in admission to B.Com.
- (ii) Provided that the candidate who has passed the qualifying examination with science stream shall be given preference in admission to B.Sc.

### MINIMUM PERCENTAGE OF MARKS REQUIRED

1. A candidate seeking admission to B.A. 1<sup>st</sup> year shall have passed senior secondary (+2) examination or an examination equivalent thereto of a Board/University established by law in India with pass in four written subjects (including English) with **33% marks**. Provided that a candidate seeking admission to B.A. 1<sup>st</sup> year with Mathematics as one of the subject of study should have obtained either **45% marks** in aggregate or **45 marks** in mathematics at +2 level. (5% marks relaxation for SC/ST students.)
2. A candidate seeking admission to B.Sc. 1<sup>st</sup> year shall have passed senior secondary (+2) under 10+2 examination or an examination equivalent thereto of a Board/ University established by law in India with pass in four written subjects (three Science elective subjects & one English) with **45% marks**.
3. A candidate seeking admission to B.Com 1<sup>st</sup> year shall have passed senior secondary (+2) examination under 10+2 Commerce or an examination equivalent thereto of a Board/University established by law in India with pass in four written subjects (including English) with **45% marks** or 40% for those who have passed +2 examination under Commerce Group.

#### Note:

1. An applicant failing in all subjects or having a compartment in 10+2 will not be admitted.
2. For SC/ST candidates, relaxation of 5% marks in aggregate is given for admission in commerce and science but minimum 45% marks are required to get admission in Science and Commerce.

### AGE LIMIT

An applicant applying for the first year of degree course must not be more than 23 years of age (25 years for girl student only) on **01-07-2023**. The upper age limit is raised to 26 years for SC/ST applicants. However, the Vice Chancellor, H.P. University shall have the power to permit age relaxation for reason to be recorded in writing up to a maximum of six months.



All such cases may be provisionally granted age relaxation up to six months by the Principal of the college and a consolidated list of all such cases will be sent for approval of the Vice Chancellor by 31st October of every academic year.

These reservations will be applicable to those, who have passed their qualifying examination from H.P. Board of School Education or from any other Schools located within territorial Jurisdiction of Himachal Pradesh or bonafide resident of Himachal Pradesh. Sports and cultural seats will be allotted to those events which are recognized by HPU sports and co-curricular council. The final decision under sports and cultural quota will be with the respective committees constituted for the same.

## REFUSAL OF ADMISSION

1. Notwithstanding anything contained in the rules; a student shall be refused admission if his/her conduct during any previous stay in the college has been found unsatisfactory.
2. A student who has been expelled or rusticated shall not be admitted to any course of study in the college.

*Note: Admission is not a matter of right. It can be terminated at any time during the session if the conduct of student is not found satisfactory.*

## PROVISIONAL ADMISSION

The admission of a student migrating from another University shall only be treated as provisional and shall only be confirmed when he/she produces the migration certificate and a certificate of good conduct from the head of the institution last attended by him/her. Provided, however, that the student disqualified by any other University shall not be given admission during the period of disqualification.

## CONDUCT PROBATION

In case the student's stay in previous session/ during the current session is found unsatisfactory his/her admission shall be put on conduct probation for one month and after review of his/her conduct during that period admission shall be regularized / discontinued by the administration.

## ADMISSION TO NEXT YEAR

Admission to 2nd Year & 3rd year will be on roll- on basis and will remain provisional till the declaration of the result of previous class or till further directions from H.P. Govt./H.P. University.

*Note 1: A candidate failing in either one or two subjects/papers will be given compartment in that subject/papers and will be eligible for promotion to the next class. He/she will appear in the subject/paper in which he/she got the compartment. He/she will have two chances (one at the supplementary stage and one at the annual stage), available to clear his/her compartment in subjects/papers. He/she will not be awarded the degree until he/she clears all his/her courses within five years from the date of his/her admission to a particular course. A candidate failing in three or more subjects/papers will be treated as fail in that year and has to repeat the entire year.*

*Note 2: As per norms and regulations of the University 7 10(c) there shall be minor examinations after completion of approximately 2/3 of the syllabus. Awards and copies of the above test have to be shown to students and the result has to be displayed on the notice board of the department/college. Students who do not qualify in IA/CCA can be given chance by the College for minor test and submission of assignments etc. As the University has given 1st and 2nd level verification to the college/ teacher concerned and Principal respectively, therefore, it shall be responsibility of the college to upload and verify the correct award. No correction/rectification shall be allowed once the awards have been verified by the Principal. Further, it is clarified that students shall be eligible to get the admit card if he/she has qualified in CCA/IA i.e., 35% minimum, but he/she shall have to score 40% and 45% aggregate Marks in annual system and semester system as the case may be (Final theory exams and CCA). If a candidate fails to score 40%/45% Marks in aggregate he/she only have the option to appear in theory examination and CCA once uploaded and verified by the College shall not be subject to any change or improvement.*

## CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM (CBCS)

The CBCS provides an opportunity for the students to choose courses from the prescribed courses comprising core, elective/minor or skill-based courses. The courses can be evaluated following the grading system, which is considered to be better than the conventional marks system. Therefore, it is necessary to introduce uniform grading system in the entire higher education in India. This will benefit the students to move across institutions within India to begin with and across countries. The uniform grading system will also enable potential employers in assessing the performance of the candidates. In order to bring uniformity in evaluation system and computation of the Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) based on student's performance in examinations, the UGC has formulated the guidelines to be followed.

### Outline of Choice Based Credit System:

**1. Core Course:** A course, which should compulsorily be studied by a candidate as a core requirement is termed as a Core course.

**2. Elective Course:** Generally, a course which can be chosen from a pool of courses and which may be very specific or specialized or advanced or supportive to the discipline/subject of study or which provides an extended scope or which enables an exposure to some other discipline/subject/domain or nurtures the candidate's proficiency/skill is called an Elective Course.

**2.1 Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) Course:** Elective courses may be offered by the main discipline/subject of study is referred to as Discipline Specific Elective. The University/Institute may also offer discipline related Elective courses of interdisciplinary nature (to be offered by main discipline/subject of study).

**2.2 Generic Elective (GE) Course:** An elective course chosen generally from an unrelated discipline/subject, with an intention to seek exposure is called a Generic Elective.

**P.S.:** A core course offered in a discipline/subject may be treated as an elective by other discipline/subject and vice versa and such electives may also be referred to as Generic Elective.

**3. Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC)/Skill Development Courses:** The Ability Enhancement (AE) Courses may be of two kinds: AE Compulsory Course (AECC) and AE Elective Course (AEEC). "AECC" courses are the courses based upon the content that leads to Knowledge enhancement. They ((i) Environmental Science, (ii) English/MIL Communication) are mandatory for all disciplines. AEEC courses are value-based and/or skill-based and are aimed at providing hands-on-training, competencies, skills, etc.

**3.1 Ability Enhancement Compulsory Course (AECC):** Environmental Science, English Communication/MIL Communication.

**3.2 Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC):** These courses may be chosen from a pool of courses designed to provide value-based and/or skill-based instruction.

All Courses (Core and Elective) will have an evaluation system that comprises of the following two components:

1. **Continuous Comprehensive Assessment (CCA)** accounting for 30% (for Arts and Commerce) & 30% (for Science) of the final grade that a student gets in a course, and
2. **End-Semester Examination (ESE)** accounting for the remaining 70% (Arts/Commerce) & 50%Theory + 20% Practical (Science) of the final grade that the student gets in a course.

**Continuous Comprehensive Assessment (CCA)** consists of:

- (a) **Mid Term (Minor) Test:** There will be one Mid Term Test, to be conducted when approximately two– third of the syllabus has been covered.
- (b) **Seminar / Assignment / Term Paper**
- (c) **Classroom Attendance** – Each student will have to attend a minimum of 75% Lectures/Tutorials/Practicals. A student having less than 75% attendance will not be allowed to appear in the End-Semester Examination (ESE). A 5% assessment will be given on the basis of this attendance.

## **SUBJECT COMBINATIONS FOR B.A./B.COM/ B.Sc. 1<sup>ST</sup> YEAR** **Bachelor of Arts**

The candidate may choose a combination of two subjects (DSC-1 and DSC-2) from the following list of subject combinations. **Subject allocation in Arts stream would be purely on merit basis. Students are advised to choose subject combinations carefully. There will be no change in the subject combination once admission has been granted to the student in that particular subject combination.**

Students will indicate their choice of subject combinations at the time of application for admission. They will be given subject combinations on the basis of merit. If they do not qualify for any of the six mentioned options, the college reserves the right to allot the next available combination.

A candidate seeking admission in B.A. Ist shall select two DSC courses, selecting just one subject from following groups of the subjects.

## **ADMISSION PROCESS FOR FIRST YEAR**

1. The candidate seeking admission to first year has to apply on the prescribed form available online on <http://www.gcanni.edu.in>
2. After filling up of the admission form, candidate has to deposit the prospectus fee online by using credit cards/debit cards/ UPIs (BHIM/Google Pay/ phonePe/ Paytm)/ Mobile/ Internet Banking.
3. The candidate can approach the College Guidance and Counselling Committee in case they find any difficulty in filling up of the admission form during the college hours.
4. The merit lists will be displayed as per schedule mentioned in the prospectus.
5. The applicants are advised to deposit their fee online by using credit cards/debit cards/ UPIs (BHIM/Google Pay/ PhonePe/Paytm)/Mobile/Internet Banking after counseling.

## **DOCUMENTS REQUIRED TO BE UPLOADED WITH THE FORM 1.**

1. Matriculation certificate for the verification of Date of Birth.
2. 10+2 marks sheet.
3. H.P. Domicile certificate for girl students (for exemption in tuition fee).
4. Minimum 40% disability certificate and category certificate in case of students seeking admission against these seats.
5. Original character certificate from Head of the Institution last attended. In case of private candidates the character certificate must have been issued by a Gazetted officer but should not be older than 6 months from the day of submission of admission form.
6. For seat against the 'single girl child category' an Affidavit proclaiming the same from the parents is to be submitted with the admission form.
7. A student seeking admission from Board/University other than H.P. will have to upload the copy of migration certificate and the original certificate has to be submitted at the time of counselling.
8. Affidavits should be provided wherever applicable.
9. Certificate of SC/ ST from Magistrate Class-1 (Authorised Signatory) should be provided by those seeking relaxation in age/marks.
10. Any gap (latest) in the academic career of the applicant must be supported by a documentary evidence / affidavit as proof of his/ her activities during the period of gap.

1. On migration from other institutions, funds for the entire session shall be charged and tuition fee shall be charged from the time of joining the College.
2. Rs.100.00 will be charged extra from students migrating from other colleges on the account of Library Security.

**MIGRATION RULES**

1. Migration from other college to Govt. Degree College, Ani at Haripur, District Kullu and vice-versa is governed by HPU rules.
2. No migration certificate can be issued unless the student is registered with university. A migrating student will not be admitted to the college if the subject/ courses studied by him/her previously are not available in the college.
3. The migrating student must submit the following documents/information:
  - (i) Lecture attendance statement (of all subjects offered)
  - (ii) Statement of credits earned by the students under CCA
  - (iii) Character certificate from the Principal of the college last attended.
4. After migration has been sanctioned and notified by the HPU, the student must join the second college within the time period stipulated by the HPU.
5. The college first joined is entitled to the tuition fee for the month in which the university sanctions the migration. The second college is not entitled to the tuition fee for the month or part thereof.
6. The admission of the students migrating from another university or from an affiliated college or institution in the same course (including ICDEOL) shall be governed by the regulations framed by the Executive Council of HPU from time to time.
7. The admission of the student migrating from another university shall be treated as provisional and shall be confirmed when he/she produces the migration certificate issued by the University and a certificate of good conduct issued by the Head of the Institution last attended.
8. A student disqualified by another university shall not be given admission during the period of the disqualification.

## **LEAVE RULES FOR STUDENTS**

- ❖ It is compulsory for all the students to get their leave sanctioned before proceeding on any kind of leave.
- ❖ A student can proceed on leave with prior permission from the Principal, but the application should also be signed by the parents/guardian of the student and duly recommended by the tutor.
- ❖ A tutor can recommend leave up-to 3 days. For longer duration, a student should get leave application signed by the principal.
- ❖ Leave during House Examination will be sanctioned by the Principal on the recommendation of the senior tutor in special cases only.
- ❖ If a student remains absent continuously for more than 10 days without authorized leave, his/her name will be struck off from the rolls of the college. Such student will have to seek re-admission by submitting an application giving the reason to the Principal with recommendation of the teacher concerned and on payment of the prescribed fee.
- ❖ Leave on account of illness must be accompanied by a Medical Certificate.

## **RE-ADMISSION**

Students can seek re-admission twice during the session. First re-admission will be allowed within ten days after the name is struck off after paying a fine of Rs. 100/- and a fine of Rs. 200/- will be charged for the second re-admission within ten days after the name is struck off from the rolls. No student will be allowed to seek admission after two times of re-admission.

## **LIBRARY RULES**

To inculcate the habit of reading among student various magazines, newspapers and employment newspaper are being subscribed on monthly basis. In order to meet the student demand, it is equipped with Photostat machine, adequate furniture, e-library with AC facility. The computerization of library, cataloguing of books and use of latest library software like INFLIBNET has also been provided for the benefit of the students.

- ❖ A student after admission is required to collect the Library-cum-Identity card on production of his/her fee receipt. The card should be kept carefully by the student.
- ❖ Generally, two books are issued at an interval of 15 days, but the librarian can recall the same at any time.
- ❖ If the books are not returned by the due date, a fine of Rs. 1/- per book per day will be charged for the overdue period.
- ❖ Books are issued only on production of the Library-cum-Identity card.
- ❖ Reference books and periodicals/ journals/ magazines are not issued; however, the students can consult the same in the library.
- ❖ The student shall be responsible for the book as soon as it is issued. Books torn/ damaged/ defaced in any manner will not be accepted. In case of loss of a book, the student will have to replace the book or pay fine in addition to the present price of the book with special permission of the Principal.

- ❖ In case of loss of the Library-cum-Identity card, the duplicate can be had by making an application to the Principal, paying Rs.20/- and on production of the copy of the FIR lodged with the police.
- ❖ If a student fails to claim refund of library security within one year of leaving the college, it shall automatically stand lapsed.

## **CO-CURRICULAR / EXTENSION ACTIVITIES**

The various curricular activities in the class rooms help only in imparting bookish knowledge to the students as per the demands of the examination system, but unless certain other activities are undertaken, a student never acquires other required skills for his all over growth. It is here that the role of co-curricular activities comes in. Such activities along with class room involvement help to integrate the three very vital aspects of an individual (student) viz. the body, mind and soul. With the above objectives in mind, various clubs and societies have been constituted under the guidance of the able teachers. Students are advised to join at least one of the clubs and respective subject societies to become ennobled graduates on completion of their courses in this college. A student with mere bookish knowledge and nothing else is a misfit in today's society and hardly acceptable to any job offering agency.

**NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME:** The NSS is a very important part of the activities of an educational institution which helps in developing the spirit of service among the students. The college has been allotted one unit (100 volunteers) of NSS by HP University. The new students shall be enrolled as NSS volunteers to take up regular as well as special camp activities in and around the College under NSS Programme Officer as envisaged under the spirit of the scheme in the beginning of the session. The enrolment is made by selection keeping in view the interest of the student in social service. The NSS volunteers attend one day camp, 7-Day Annual Camp, conduct village surveys and are involved in other college activities and functions and thus get great opportunities for their development and training.

**THE BHARAT SCOUTS AND GUIDES:** The Bharat Scouts and Guides is a voluntary organization. It is devoted to the development of character of the young generation and selfless service to the country. The college has rovers and rangers unit for boys and girls of age group 17 to 25. One group consists of 24 Rovers and 24 Rangers. The Rovers and Rangers are sent to attend the training camps from time to time and are engaged in various college activities and functions resulting into great learning to them.

**SPORTS:** Renowned Philosopher Socrates has said: "What a disgrace it is for a man to grow old without ever seeing the beauty and strength which the body is capable." Our college fully realizes the significance of sports activities and ensures that our students remain engaged in activities throughout the year. The college has facilities for all major sports activities. Every effort will be made to participate in the activities organized by H.P. University from time to time.

**CULTURAL ACTIVITIES:** It has been rightly said, "Music is food of soul", and to encourage student in this direction so as to preserve our culture from the ill effects of the

western world, cultural activities are carried out in the college. The college CSCA cultural function “Seraj Dhvani” a fiesta of cultural echoes of Seraj area is held in the college every year. Participation of the students in all youth functions is ensured.

**RED RIBBON CLUB:** As per directions of HP AIDS Control Society, college carries out AIDS related awareness activities. On AIDS Day various programs on AIDS awareness are organized with competitions like declamation contests and slogan writing to create awareness among the masses about the virus of AIDS and to tell how it is expanding all over the world.

**SERAJ ENERGY CLUB:** To enlighten people about the value of energy and the methods to save power, Seraj Energy Club has been established with the collaboration of HPSEB. Power Conservation Programme is being organized in the college with slogan like writing competition, declamation contest and a rally march under the aegis of this club.

**LITERARY AND SUBJECT SOCIETIES:** In order to explore the hidden talent of the students, various subject societies organize different kinds of activities to promote the understanding of the subjects which students have undertaken in degree courses.

**GENDER CHAMPIONS:** As per the Govt. direction, our gender champions (Men and Women) are continuously working with the mandate to provide an integrated and interdisciplinary approach to understanding the social and cultural constructions of gender that shape the experiences of women and men in society. The aim is to make the young boys and girls gender sensitive and create positive social norms that value the girls and their rights.

**ROAD SAFETY CLUB:** Road Safety Club was formed in the college in the session 2021-22 with the purpose of spreading road safety awareness among the college students.

**ECO CLUB:** Eco Club plays an important role in creating environmental awareness amongst the future generation. It motivates the students to keep their surroundings green and clean by undertaking plantation of trees and promote ethos of conservation natural resources.

## **COLLEGE MAGAZINE**

The College publishes its magazine “SerajVani” every year. It has various sections covering write-ups in English, Hindi, Commerce, Science, Pahari and Planning Forum showing the creative skills of the young student-writers. The College magazine provides an opportunity to the budding students/writers to express their creative, innovative and analytical views with regard to various issues. 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## **COLLEGE STUDENT CENTRAL ASSOCIATION (CSCA)**

In order to inculcate leadership qualities among the students and to provide platform to address the students’ problems, College Student Central Association (CSCA) shall be constituted in the college in accordance with the University Notification. The college CSCA is a nominated body of the students, comprising of president, vice president, general secretary, joint secretary, class and nominated representative on the basis of academic achievements.

## **PARENT TEACHER ASSOCIATION (PTA)**

Parent Teacher Association of Govt. College, Ani has been established with a motive of constructive interaction between parents and teachers. It has contributed a lot in the development of the College. Its main objectives include revival of the relationship between the parents and teachers, to create the healthy educational environment, to arrange discussions with the elder persons of the society from time to time and incorporate their suggestions for the improvement of the educational standards, to suggest ways so that students' education is promoted, to make a collective effort to improve the conduct of the students and also to restrict the entry of anti-social elements in the campus, to inform the parents/guardians about the performance of their wards from time to time and to make arrangement for the parents to meet the concerned staff once in a quarter, to arrange teachers etc. when there is shortage of staff in the institution as a temporary measure, and to make the parents aware of various schemes of the Govt. in the area of education. All the parents by virtue of the admission of their wards are member of the Parent Teacher Association (PTA). There will be compulsory general house meeting for all the parents in the beginning of the session and date shall be communicated at the time of the admission.

Parents (father or mother) or guardians (only blood relation) may please make it convenient to attend the meeting in the interest of the college and their wards. It may please be noted that no separate communication regarding the meeting will be sent. It is the duty of the students to remind and persuade their parents/ guardians to attend the same.

## **CAREER COUNSELLING AND PLACEMENT CELL**

The College has established a Career Guidance and Counseling Cell for the benefit of the students as per the instructions of the Government. The members of the Cell are always available to guide the students in selecting and pursuing the most suitable career considering their abilities. The Committee also aims at helping the students in developing their personalities and sharpening their communication skills.

## **GRIEVANCES AND REDRESSAL MECHANISM**

- ❖ The students will have the right to make an appeal against any component of evaluation. Such appeal has to made to the Principal of the College on a prescribed form and should clearly state in writing the reason(s) for the complaint/appeal.
- ❖ The appeal will be placed before the Grievance Redressal committee (GRC), Chaired by the college Principal for cases pertaining the core/elective/generic courses.
- ❖ Any other type of grievance may be heard by the said committee.

## **CODE OF CONDUCT AND DISCIPLINE**

1. Every student should carry his/her Identity Card, which is issued to the students after the admission. It should be shown /produced on demand. The loss of the card should be reported through FIR immediately.
2. Any act of ragging on the campus will be severely dealt with. Ragging implies harassment, physical or mental torture to another student by a student or group of students.
3. The Principal and the members of the staff have the power to take disciplinary action against students indulging in act of indiscipline, which may lead to imposing fine, or suspension, rustication or expulsion of the guilty student. Following acts will be construed as acts of misconduct and indiscipline and punished with either fine or suspension/expulsion or both:
  - Writing obscenities/dirty words on black boards, walls or furniture or banging doors etc. and other furniture.
  - Loitering aimlessly in the verandas/ corridors, making noise or trying to disturb classes.



- Smoking, taking drugs/alcohol and chewing tobacco, spitting etc. in the college campus.
- Bringing outsiders/miscreants/anti- social elements in the campus.
- Pasting posters on the walls or notice on the Notice Board without prior permission of the Principal.
- Misbehaving with teachers/other staff.
- Holding of any meeting on the campus without prior permission.
- Using mobile phones in the class rooms.
- Indulging in any rash/ unbecoming behavior
- Damage of any kind to college property including defacement of walls, damage to furniture, etc.

4. Parents/Guardians are requested to remain in touch with the Principal and the teachers regarding the progress of their wards.

## **TUTORIALS/REMEDIAL CLASSES**

All the students will be divided into different tutorials groups for the purpose of academic excellence and greater interaction between teacher and the taught. Teacher-in-charge of each group will provide assistance/counseling/guidance regarding academics and other activities periodically.

## **SCHOLARSHIPS**

The college grants various scholarships in various categories to the deserving students as per the rules/directions issued by the state government from time to time. Some important categories are as follows: Meritorious students IRDP, SC, ST, OBC, Physically challenged, Economically Backward classes.

There are more than 20 scholarships available to students under varied conditions and requirements. ## **ZERO TOLERANCE TO RAGGING**

The students are informed that under the orders of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India as well as Hon'ble High Court of Himachal Pradesh and The Himachal Pradesh University Notification o. 1-14/HPU/DSW/08-/360 Dated 10th July, 2008, Ragging in Educational Institutions including Hostels is strictly banned. Any student found guilty of ragging will be imprisoned for a term which may extend for the three years or fine which may extend to Rs 50,000/- or both.

### **HIMACHAL PRADESH EDUCATION INSTITUTIONS (PROHIBITION OF RAGGING) ACT 2009**

- ❑ No student shall indulge in ragging in any form, within or outside the premises of an educational institution
- ❑ Any person if on prima facie evidence is found guilty will be suspended from the educational institution
- ❑ On Conviction, be punished with imprisonment for term which may extend to 3 years or with fine which may extend to fifty thousand or with both
- ❑ Will be expelled from the College/Institution
- ❑ Expelled student will not be admitted in any other Institution for a period of three years from the date of order of such expulsion

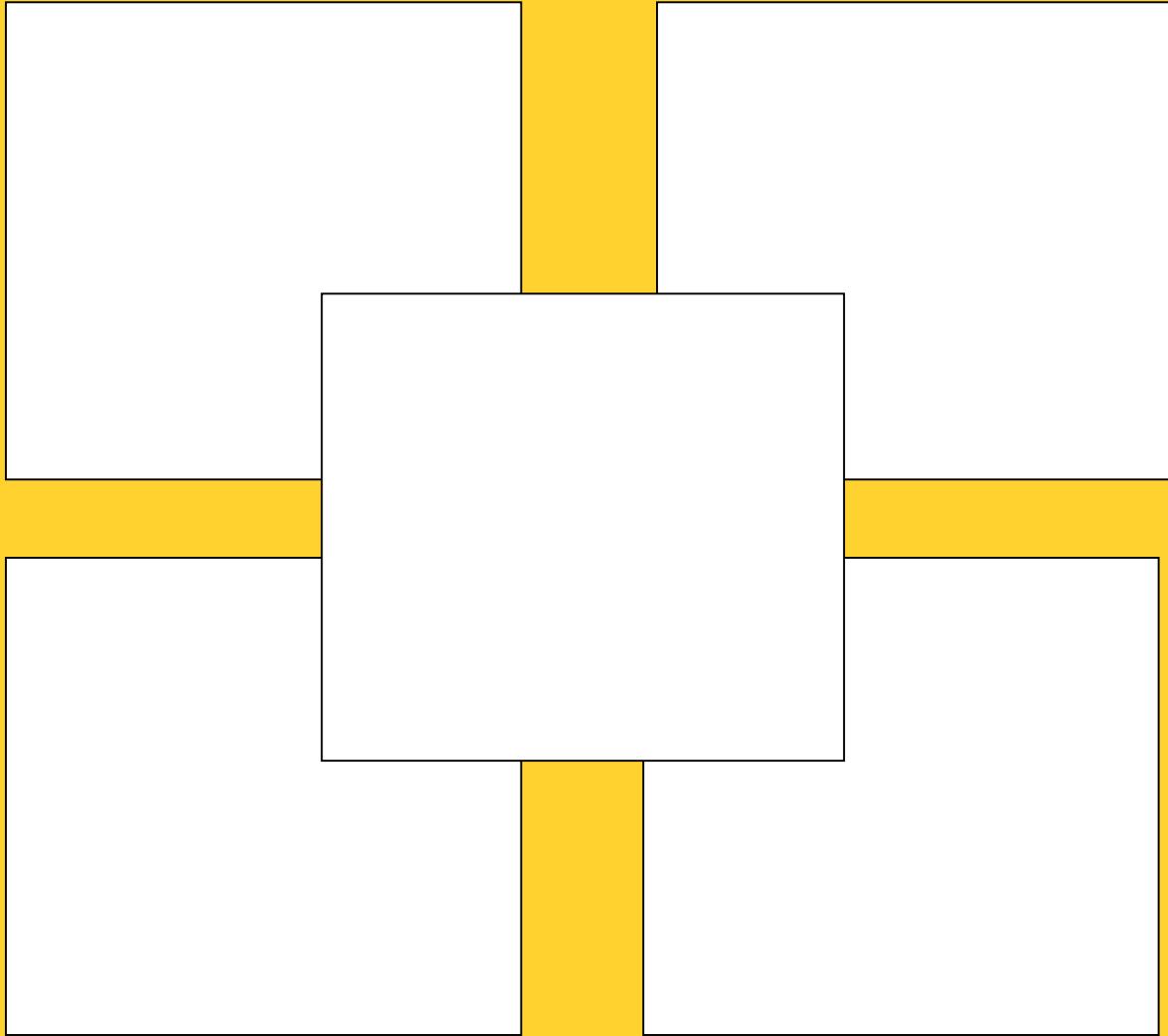
